perverted his relationship with God. He had forsaken God and God had forsaken him as king of Israel.

The Lord had revealed to Samuel that David from the tribe of Judah would be the next king. King David is a prolific king. Defeating Goliath with just a sling and stone, killing 10,000s of Philistines delivering Israel from all its enemies and providing the eventual peace God had intended the Israelites to live under since their arrival in Canaan.
